Lexicon

âlârod ‘body, appearance; physical, outward’

âlâwes ‘family as a social unit’ (relating to any family relationship other than descent by blood, especially marriage)

âm ‘with, and’

argîn ‘possibility, opportunity, option; can, may; possible, optional; maybe’

ârûc ‘eye, sight; watch, keep an eye on, stalk, follow, chase; visible’

ârunin ‘human’ (especially in contrast with non-humans)

atanûrîm ‘to be used to; common, familiar’

bêret-bêret ‘many, more’ (lit. ‘seven-seven’)

bêrôc ‘hair, string; fine, detailed’

dâlon ‘way, path, journey, travels; to travel, wander, go’

dîl ‘then’ (what follows *dîl* happened after what preceded it)

êkerân ‘meeting; to meet, collect, gather; together, united’

elod î-’tanîterân ‘birch’

emoc ‘to decide, judge, rule’

enâc ‘there, LOC’

êtin 1st person pronoun

fêgûren ‘to be, to exist’

imêlûdor ‘thought, consideration, inner monologue; to think, consider; inner, inward’

în 3rd person pronoun

isînûc ‘memory, image, imagination, vision; to remember; visual, schematic’

kâmârod ‘heart, soul, life; to live, spring, have a heartbeat; alive, natural, normal’

kâmûren ‘seed; to sow’ (figuratively relates to descent, esp. paternity)

kênôr ‘worth, value; to want, desire; valuable, desirable’

kêwes ‘value, price; to trade, buy, sell’

kûlûnâc ‘truth; to vouch, swear, promise; true’

kun ‘to have’

kûnâsh ‘leg, foot; to limp’

manûlakish ‘tools, skill, skillset; MILIT. a type of scimitar; to work a fine art (including swordfighting); able, proficient, battle-hardened’

mârûd ‘crossroads, tree crotch, split; to diverge, cross, run into; item, or’

mârûd ... mârûd ‘either ... or’

mâtenâc ‘honour, honouring; to honour, gift, present; honourable’

mêlûdin ‘story, tale, speech; say, tell, speak’

menârîmor ‘magic, sorcery, spell, cult, cult site; to conjur; magical, occult’

mênûrû ‘deity, higher power, creator; to create, originate, invent; divine, sacred’

mîd ‘before’ (what follows *mîd* happened before what preceded it)

mîlûd ‘speech; to speak, say’

mînoc ‘country’

mîrênonî ‘to hide’

mishûdan ‘discomfort, aversion; be made uncomfortable by something, hate something’

moshûd ‘bad luck, doom, destiny; doomed, bad’

mûnâshet ‘all, everything, everyone, everyone, always’

nâkerân ‘barrier, frontier, border, end, fence; to end, terminate, stop, prevent, contain, leave; over, done; outside of’

nâkûn ‘illustration, expression, word, name’ (often used to introduce proper names)

nâlac ‘hand; FIG. spirit, thoughts, telekinesis; to take, grasp’

nîn ‘long’

nishûnâc ‘home; to arrive, return; at home’

nitêshîdîsh ‘hurry; to hurry, make haste, be busy, be occupied; on the way, fast, occupied’

nôr ‘at, on, above’

nôwîs ‘soil; to grow’

nûkêm ‘made of iron; hard, tight; knife, sword’

nûkîsh ‘ingredients; to contain, consist of; to put together, assemble; of (partitive)’

nûn ‘down, under’

nûrîm ‘wonder, miracle, rarity; to surprise, impress; MILIT. to ambush; wonderful, special, rare’

nûroc ‘lightning, blade, knife’

rîsh ‘corner, edge; turn, change of direction, crossroads; to turn, return, change directions, rethink; pointy, edgy; different, new’

rûtûkin ‘forest, woodland’

sân ‘equivalent, mirror image; to match, mirror, equate; same, similar’

sârîsh ‘circle, ring, crown’

sen ‘big, large’

shâwen ‘one’

sîrish ‘exit, escape; leave, disappear, go away; alone’

tâin 2nd person pronoun

tâlanâc ‘work; to do, to make’ (commonly with a verbal complement)

tânûc ‘stock, collection, herd, group, people; a group of people’

têrûc ‘wild animal, beast; free, wild, untamed’

tesh ‘by, thus’ (expresses a way something is done)

têtân ‘section, unit, verse; to define, divide’

tîl ‘need, necessity, obligation; to need, must; necessary’

tônîm ‘dwelling, abode, accommodation; live, dwell, seek shelter; accommodate’

tûlûren ‘wall, fortress, protection, defence; to protect, defend’

tûn ‘[if], then’ (the if-clause is unmarked)

tûnish ‘way, path; goal, objective, mission; plan, enterprise; to do; to plan, work towards a goal; to form, create; to carry, bear, put, place’

tûrîn ‘two’
